# FRITZ COLEMAN

**MASTER OF CEREMONIES** 

A Southern California broadcasting icon, Fritz is well-known for his sense of humor and extensive knowledge of weather. He joined NBC4 in 1982 as the weekend weathercaster and moved to weekdays in 1984. Coleman was part of the longest-running evening news team with legendary journalists Chuck Henry, Colleen Williams and Sports Anchor Fred Roggin.

Coleman has been named "Best Weathercaster" in nearly every major newspaper in Southern California. He devotes much of his free time to supporting events, frequently organizing evenings of entertainment to benefit local non-profit organizations. Coleman has garnered several awards and honors for his dedication to community service. In 2019, he received an honorary doctorate from Woodbury University in Burbank for his extensive public service in the community. Since 2000, he has won Humanitarian of the Year Awards – including from Shelter Partnership and California Hospital Medical Center. The City of Los Angeles named Coleman a "Treasure of Los Angeles," and the United States House of Representatives gave him the Humanitarian of the Year Award for his fundraising efforts on behalf of the American Red Cross. Coleman has also been honored by the Los Angeles Chapter of the Salvation Army for his long-time commitment to the organization.

A Navy veteran, Coleman is originally from Philadelphia and attended Salem College in West Virginia and Temple University in Philadelphia where he studied radio, television and film. Coleman is an avid cyclist, runner, rollerblader and skier and proudly serves on the Board of Trustees for Children's Burn Foundation. He is a valuable member of Children's Burn Foundation's Marketing Team, creating and starring in our Burn Prevention & Education social media posts. He lives in the San Fernando Valley and has two sons and a daughter.



# JACQUES LESURE THE GUITARLOSPHER

ENTERTAINMENT

Jacques, a Detroit native now residing in Inglewood, California, is known for his classic yet innovative approach to music, which defines his signature sound. As an artist on the prestigious WJ3 Records label, he has released three acclaimed recordings, earning a four-star rating from DownBeat Magazine and a spot in Jazz Week's "Top 100."

He has performed and recorded with renowned artists across various genres, including Bernadette Peters, Pharoah Sanders, Gregory Porter, Jimmy Smith, Carmen Lundy, The Clark Sisters, Little Milton, and James Brown. His work extends to film and television, with appearances in La La Land and other productions.

For over 20 years, Jacques has been a fixture in the Los Angeles jazz scene, providing top-tier live performances at local venues. A dedicated educator, Jacques is a professor of Global Jazz Studies at UCLA and an active member of the Jazz Educators Network, the Chamber Music Society of America, and the American Federation of Musicians. He mentors young artists through organizations such as the Thelonious Monk Institute, Music Los Angeles, and the Dolo Coker Foundation. He also serves as an adjudicator for competitions nationwide and is a past president of the African American Jazz Caucus.

Beyond music, Jacques is deeply involved in his community. He serves as Chairman of the Inglewood Arts Commission, is a member of 100 Black Men Los Angeles Chapter, and a founding member of The Gathering Spot LA. His commitment to jazz and community engagement continues to inspire and shape the next generation of musicians.

# 2025 Spirit of Humanity Honoree

# Wallis Annenberg



Wallis Annenberg has dedicated her philanthropic work for decades to addressing the critical needs of our time, evolving from traditional grant-making to pursue innovative and impactful solutions through place-based initiatives, support for emerging local and national leaders, and cross-sector convenings and communication that advance community-driven solutions to help the underserved. As Chairman of the Board, President, and Chief Executive Officer of The Annenberg Foundation since 2009, she has directed support to a wide range of issues, including the preservation and promotion of the arts, conservation, affordable housing, food insecurity, aging and longevity, access to health care, animal welfare, education, and social justice. Since assuming chairmanship, Annenberg's robust philanthropy has impacted more than 2,800 nonprofits and other organizations and special projects, including training for nonprofit leaders. She has catalyzed an array of interventions and projects that reflect the Annenberg Foundation's core values of community, compassion, diversity, and fairness.

### Some of her greatest contributions include:

CONSERVATION: The Wallis Annenberg Wildlife Crossing — Wallis made possible the world's largest urban wildlife crossing, being built in Southern California to preserve and protect animals and ecosystems along the heavily trafficked U.S. Highway 101. Upon its completion, expected in 2026, the wildlife bridge will revitalize local biodiversity and reconnect habitats in Southern California's mountains and valleys. Wallis's generous contribution and call to action kickstarted a campaign for wildlife bridges across the country.

# 2025 Spirit of Humanity Honoree

# Wallis Annenberg

- AGING AND LONGEVITY: GenSpace In 2022, Annenberg opened a state-of-the-art community center for older adults in L.A.'s
  Koreatown. GenSpace was Wallis's personal vision, and she worked tirelessly to ensure it would be a unique place where older
  Angelenos could learn and thrive together. Through thought leadership, activities, and events, GenSpace is helping redefine
  perspectives on aging in the 21st century.
- ANIMAL WELFARE: Wallis Annenberg PetSpace Annenberg built and continues to fund a safe haven for animals, in response to overcrowding in animal shelters across Southern California following the pandemic and housing challenges. PetSpace trains veterinarians and physical therapists who work with animals and offers ongoing programming to strengthen the human-animal bond.
- COMMUNITY ACCESS: The Annenberg Community Beach House Annenberg initiated and funded the transformation of five acres along Pacific Coast Highway, refurbishing a long-shuttered, dilapidated beach club into a modern public beach house on the increasingly unaffordable Southern California coastline. The Annenberg Community Beach House opened in 2009 and provides public access to a pool, boardwalk and beach, children's play areas, event space, classes, and other recreational opportunities in partnership with California State Parks and the City of Santa Monica.
- ARTS AND CULTURE: The Wallis Annenberg Performing Arts Center Recognizing the need for more performing arts venues in the L.A. area, Annenberg funded the renovation of the historic Beverly Hills Post Office in 2004 and established a performing arts center that offers world-class entertainment as well as a diverse arts curriculum and professional theater training for young people and the underserved.
- FREE PRESS: Fallen Journalists Memorial Continuing its long history of supporting communications and journalism, the Foundation most recently provided seed funding to build the first memorial in the United States honoring journalists and photojournalists who died in the line of duty, located adjacent to iconic monuments on the National Mall.
- ACCESSIBILITY: Treehouse for All (2005) The first universally accessible treehouse in a public space in California, the
  Treehouse for All in Torrance, Calif., was created for children and adults of all ages and physical abilities—and inspired dozens of
  similar treehouses to be built nationally.

Wallis Annenberg is a life trustee of the University of Southern California and has been honored by numerous organizations, including the Kennedy Center, Americans for the Arts, the Shoah Foundation, and the California African American Museum. She serves on the boards of the California Science Center, the Music Center and the Performing Arts Center, the LA Philharmonic, the LA County Museum of Art, the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County, the Harlem Children's Zone, and the Museum of Modern Art in New York, among others.

Wallis Annenberg received one of the nation's highest honors, the National Humanities Medal. The Medal "honors an individual or organization whose work has deepened the nation's understanding of the human experience, broadened citizens' engagement with history or literature, or helped preserve and expand Americans' access to cultural resources." With Wallis Annenberg's recognition today, the Annenberg family has received three Presidential medals. Ambassador Walter H. Annenberg, the founder of the Annenberg Foundation, received the Medal of Freedom in 1986 and the National Medal of Arts in 1993.

Thirty years ago, Carol Mancino founded the Council of Children's Burn Foundation with the vision of creating meaningful experiences for child burn survivors and their families - helping them not just to survive but to thrive after their injuries. The Council works tirelessly to plan events such as Camp Gung Ho and the annual holiday celebration that allow child burn survivors and their families to come together and have fun. CBF program participants spend quality time with their loved ones and also bond with their "CBF family." Attendees meet other children and parents who have been through similar experiences and have the opportunity to share in a safe space.

The Council supports the Foundation's community outreach and fundraising efforts, including the annual Giving New Hope benefit and the new Taste of Hope event. Since 1996, the Council has raised over 28 million dollars.





Children's Burn Foundation (CBF) heals child burn survivors and their families through comprehensive physical, financial and emotional care while educating communities in California and across the globe on how to prevent and treat burns. Children's Burn Foundation has impacted more than two-and-a-half million children through its programs.

The CBF International Outreach Program forges meaningful relationships with partners around the world. As a result, children can receive care closer to home whenever possible, providing faster healing times and less emotional shock as families are not forced to leave their homes and travel to far, unfamiliar places for medical attention. This model has allowed Children's Burn Foundation to serve 38 nations and help more families at a lower cost.

Today, Children's Burn Foundation's prevention and education programs are in 20 hospitals and 24 other partnerships, and in more than 150 schools nationwide. CBF is also branching out to pediatrician offices and health clinics to reach the most at-risk populations to minimize preventable burn injuries to young children.

Safety Smart Parents and Safety Smart Kids is being marketed nationwide to parent groups, Head Start agencies and special needs programs. The Safety Smart Babies program reached over 55,000 parents and caregivers, expanding the program exponentially. Finally, L.A. Troupe Safety Smart, a highly inventive theatrical group that teaches young children life-saving fire safety and burn prevention skills, expanded outside of Los Angeles to dozens of new schools in the Houston Independent School District, and to Las Vegas public schools, reaching more than 95,000 children.



# Children's Burn Foundation's Fire Safety Tips

### FIRE IS FAST, HOT, DARK AND DEADLY

### To protect your children, do the following:

### **Prepare:**

- Install smoke alarms on every level, in corridors leading to sleeping areas and in all bedrooms.
- Test them once a month and change the battery twice a year. Smoke alarms are inexpensive and save lives!
- · Sleep with bedroom doors closed.

### Remember the following escape tips:

- Check the door with the back of your hand if you feel heat, use your second exit.
- If there is smoke, crawl on your hands and knees to the nearest exit.
- Teach children how to get out of the house.
- Call 9-1-1 from a neighbor's house.
- NEVER go back into a burning house. GET OUT AND STAY OUT!

### If you are trapped, take these steps:

- Stay low near the door or window.
- Put blankets, rugs or pillows at the bottom of the door to keep out smoke.
- Signal out of the window with a sheet, towel or flashlight.

### Once outside, make sure to:

- Count all family members at your meeting place.
- If someone is missing, tell the firefighters where that person may be. NEVER go back inside.

### **Full Recovery**

In an instant, a child's whole life can be shattered by a severe burn. Without access to comprehensive care, that child and their family will suffer devastating physical, financial and emotional harm. Children's Burn Foundation provides child burn survivors and their families with the comprehensive healing they need, from life-transforming surgeries to psychological support until the child is 18 years old. The Full Recovery Program services are tailored to the needs of each young burn survivor, so the child burn survivors don't just survive; they thrive.

### **Family Emergency Assistance**

The trauma of a burn injury affects the entire family. Parents often must take time off from work to be with their children in the hospital and at home. For many, this can lead to a devastating financial crisis. The Foundation's Family Emergency Assistance Program assists low-income families in relieving financial stresses so that families can focus on their child's recovery. This support includes transportation, emergency housing assistance, food vouchers and other needed services.

### **Child & Family Support Groups**

Children's Burn Foundation provides survivors with the guidance, community and comprehensive care they need. Facilitated by trained professionals, burn survivors speak openly about their experiences in a safe space and feel understood by their peers.

The unique challenges that child burn survivors face affect not only them but also their parents and siblings. Parents desperately want to help their children but do not always know how. Siblings can feel overwhelmed and afraid as their family navigates the uncertainty and stress of a burn accident. With the help of child life specialists, social workers, and group facilitators, children, parents and siblings come together for support groups designed to help guide them through the long and complicated healing process. After sessions, many families express how they no longer feel alone in their journey and think of support groups as their "CBF family". Sessions are held twice per month in person, and additional support groups are available virtually for parents across the United States.

### **Teen Support Groups**

Children's Burn Foundation provides a teen support program for burn survivors ages 13 through 18. Teens meet twice monthly with skilled group facilitators to share their stories and open up about challenges or accomplishments. Participants build self-esteem, learn smart decision-making, and how to navigate stressful situations. They also participate in group activities that promote community service, teamwork and bonding. Program graduates often share lifelong friendships they developed in the program.

Children's Burn Foundation is proud to provide a supportive and nurturing environment for our teens that allows them to grow in ways they might not have thought possible. The teens learn to reach their full potential as confident speakers, community leaders and caring human beings. This year, our support groups include three support group graduates who are now leading the groups in facilitator roles.



# Burn Prevention Education

### SAFETY SMART PROGRAMS

Although people of all ages are at risk for a burn injury, children under age five are particularly susceptible. Most burns in this age group are scalds from hot liquids or food. It is estimated that eighty percent of these devastating injuries can be prevented through education.

Surveys reported 86% of participants made at least one change in their home to prevent burns. 100% of respondents reported sharing information with others. All Safety Smart programs are free and available in English and Spanish.

Safety Smart Parents consists of comprehensive burn prevention programs for parents and caregivers of small children in the most vulnerable communities:



- Virtual and Live Presentations teach how childhood burns happen and how to prevent them, as well as first aid for minor burns. Materials include the Look Out Lucky! storybook, coloring pages, bath thermometer and burn safety checklists for parents.
- Educational Displays are customized to meet the needs of different populations and venues. These displays are shared at health fairs, hospital and school events.

Safety Smart Babies is a burn prevention program for new and expectant parents that provides practical, actionable tips for preventing burns in the home. Children's Burn Foundation partners with local hospitals, maternity departments, pediatricians, schools, and infant advocacy organizations to bring burn risk awareness to new parents.

Safety Smart Babies video is available free of charge and teaches how to make practical changes before bringing a baby home from the hospital. It also emphasizes how important it is to stay not just one, but two steps ahead of a burn.

Burn Awareness for Teens and Young Adults emphasizes minimizing risk-taking behavior and carelessness, which cause most burns to teens. The program is presented at schools, after-school programs and youth groups.





# Burn Prevention Education

### THE L.A. TROUPE SAFETY SMART

L.A. Troupe Safety Smart program increases awareness among elementary school children of the risks of accidental burns, scalds, and fires in the home through music, theatre, and educational messaging. As a result of the program, children often become ambassadors within their communities and teach family members what to do in a fire. CBF strategically pivoted the program to include a hybrid format that reaches tens of thousands of new audience members annually across the U.S.

The program provides a Safety Smart coloring book for distribution to all participating students in grades K-3. The book reinforces messages taught by the program and corresponds to the characters children encounter in the shows.

Last year, Children's Burn Foundation developed a Western-themed show to teach about outdoor burn dangers, including wildfires. The show is a lively program that teaches children life-saving information about fire safety and burn prevention in a unique and engaging way.



# Look Out Lucky!

The Look Out Lucky! program features an engaging animated video series and a newly released companion book designed to teach young children essential burn prevention concepts. The book and video follow the adventures of Camo the Chameleon and Lucky the Curious Kitten as they encounter and navigate burn hazards in the kitchen. This resource is ideal for children ages four to seven, as well as for parents, caregivers, and educators in pre- and primary schools. It also includes valuable burn prevention and first-aid tips for adults throughout the story, educational and age-appropriate activity and coloring pages. Recently, a episode of Look Out Lucky! has been developed, set in Africa. Given the rising number of burn cases and the severity of injuries reported by our burn care partners in Africa, it was crucial to address burn prevention where it is most needed. This episode is produced in Portuguese, which is spoken in Mozambique, and focuses on burn safety topics relevant to the region, aiming to make a significant impact on local communities and help save more lives.





# International Outreach Program



The International Outreach Program saves lives and improves the health and well-being of burn survivors worldwide. In recent years, Children's Burn Foundation International Outreach Program model has shifted from sending burn teams to developing countries to treat patients, to forging partnerships with centers of excellence in the developing world. By providing care closer to home, CBF is able to save far more lives.

Additionally, Children's Burn Foundation has provided funds to purchase medical supplies and advanced equipment for centers in these countries to help deliver innovative burn care. CBF also has acquired in-kind donations of artificial skin, wound care products, medical equipment and supplies to help achieve better surgical results.

Children's Burn Foundation partners with burn centers in Africa, Central America, South America, Eastern Europe, India and the Middle East. Focusing efforts in countries where burn prevention efforts are strongly integrated into health and education systems result in burn prevention programs that are highly effective and farreaching.

# Fire! Science & Safety Exhibit



Welcome to apartment #911 at Casa Del Fuego! The space is carefully curated to help visitors act as fire danger detectives on a mission to discover the science of what makes a fire and then locate the fire and burn dangers around the home. Museum-goers gain vital information about fire prevention and preparedness. Created in partnership with Children's Burn Foundation, the Fire! Science & Safety exhibit at the California Science Center raises awareness of fire and burn risks, teaches how to prevent injuries, and demonstrates what to do if a fire occurs. The self-directed exploration approach of this exhibit allows visitors to learn by doing, touching and examining the world around them.

CBF and the California Science Center continue to collaborate through social media campaigns to market the life-saving exhibit. The Fall Safety Series starring Fritz Coleman reached over 80,000 individuals and resulted in over 110,000 views to CBF's YouTube page.

The California Science Center is located in historic Exposition Park and is open daily from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Fire! Science & Safety is a FREE, permanent exhibit that does not require a reservation. All exhibit materials are available in both English and Spanish.

An average of 2.2 million people visit the museum annually, including 400,000 schoolchildren. Children's Burn Foundation continues to work with California Science Center educators to ensure that up-to-date critical safety messaging is incorporated in tours and school field trips and to help market this fun, innovative, and, most importantly, life-saving exhibit.







# Camp Gung Ho

For young burn survivors, camp is more than fun-filled summer activities. It provides a unique opportunity to surround themselves with other children who can relate to their experiences. It offers a chance to open up about their scars in a safe environment. Instead of worrying about upcoming medical procedures and doctor's appointments, campers can enjoy days to the fullest and just be kids!

This year's camps included a pool party at the beautiful home of Adriana & Jay Balaban in Calabasas. Young burn survivors and their siblings enjoyed a day of fun, celebrating resilience and friendship.

Camp Gung Ho created a haven where children facing the challenge of burn injuries bonded with peers who truly understand their journey. Laughter echoed across the water, and new friendships blossomed under the summer sun. Wendy, a 15-year-old burn survivor, shared that she feels safe, and, thanks to CBF, she is proud of herself and not afraid to share her story. "I am me, and I think that's more than enough!"

This summer's lineup also included arcade games, a private movie screening, and a family beach and surf day. These events provided wonderful experiences for our young burn survivors and their families.
